

Nick and Mary Ann spent the whole of 2024 working on a very special new series, our first independent TV production for the BBC, and to say we are excited is a bit of an understatement!

'Rùrachd' is a 6-part series on BBC iPlayer and BBC ALBA dedicated to the joys of wild food foraging and seeking out the very best of nature's bounty throughout Scotland. It's the first ever UK TV series devoted to foraging, and it's led by the best! Mary Ann is joined by her good friend and one of the rising stars of the foraging firmament Lucy Cooke (<u>www.thewildcooke.com</u>), exploring behind 'the green veil' sharing the huge variety of plants, seaweeds and fungi that are 'math is math dhuit' (they're good, and they're good for you), and blending Lucy's huge foraging knowledge and skills with Mary Ann's Gaelic upbringing and their shared loved of cooking for friends. The result is a big adventure through woodland, seashore, moorland, saltmarsh

Directed by Nick and produced by Mary Ann as Watercolour Studios, the series is fact-filled, informative, sustainable, mindful, safe! and full of fun.
